Put all of your paper, plastics, cans, glass & cardboard together in the same container of your choice.

<b>METAL &amp; GLASS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>aluminum &amp; steel/tin cans (drink, food, &amp; pet food)</li> <li>EMPTY aerosol cans (<b>except</b> pesticide and spray paint)</li> <li>aluminum foil</li> <li>aluminum foil bake ware</li> <li>glass, food, &amp; beverage bottles &amp; jars (any color)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>propane cylinders</li> <li>metal lawn chairs</li> <li>pots &amp; pans</li> <li>scrap metal</li> <li>window glass</li> <li>dishes &amp; cookware</li> <li>ceramics (plates, bowls, mugs, etc.)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>drinking glasses</li> <li>crystal</li> <li>light bulbs &amp; tubes (incandescent, LED or fluorescent)</li> <li>mirrors</li> </ul>

Plastic bags of any type must not be used to set out recyclables for collection - the bags jam machinery at the sorting facility. Many local grocery stores will accept clean, dry plastic bags for recycling or you can use reusable bags.

Empty food containers and lightly rinse before recycling; caps, labels, lids and rings may stay on the containers.
