The Town was certified at the Silver level.

Sustainable Maryland Certification: To achieve certification, municipalities are required to form a Green Team comprised of local residents, community leaders, municipal staff and officials; complete a variety sustainability-related Actions worth **a total of at least 150 points for Bronze level certification, or 400 points for Silver level certification,** and submit the appropriate documentation as evidence that the Sustainable Maryland Certified requirements have been satisfied.
